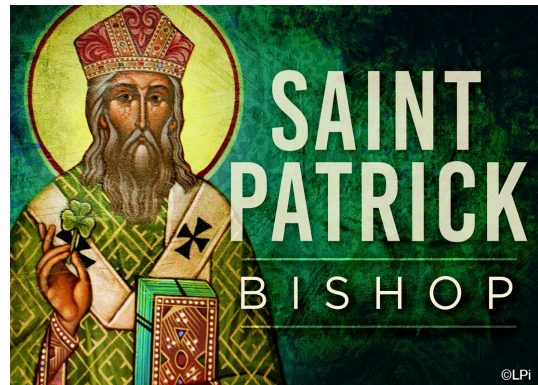

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Way of the Cross, also know as the Stations of the Cross, are a way to pray and meditate on Christ's sacrifice for us. It is divided into fourteen stations from the time He was condemned to his burial. This devotion has been long encouraged by the Church, and is especially useful during Lent and Good Friday. The devotion was developed during the Crusades when the knights and pilgrims began to follow the route of Christ's way to Calvary. This devotion spread throughout Europe and was promulgated by the Franciscan friars in the 14th and 15th centuries. Eventually, the Stations of the Cross became an important catechetical tool, and the popularity of this devotion inspired some of the greatest Christian art.



Join us as we pray the Stations of the Cross each Friday during Lent immediately following the 12PM Mass.

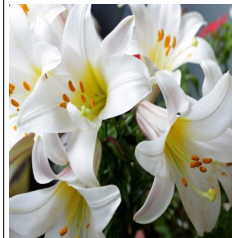
