# The Queenship of Mary ~ August 22

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the Blessed Virgin Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.

In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical *To the Queen of Heaven,* Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.

# FROM THE RECTOR - Monsignor Anthony Mancini

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

I would like to share with you the following meditation:

# The Fire Christ Desires to See

Until God has absorbed my whole life and I am completely transformed in him, everything that I do is insignificant. My works will always be imperfect. In spite of this, he is content, he urges me, not letting me rest, repeating at every instant: "Follow the name that I have given you; be an apostle of my love."

He seems to support me and assure the good results of everything that I do, so that nothing will be ineffective but everything will contribute to the increase of his love in souls. But I ask ever more, namely, that whatever I do should always continue to do good, to produce love, until the end of the world. And I seem to hear the words: "Love is a fire that spreads; it burns whatever it encounters, and nothing can put it out." Love is the divine power, the eternity of God beginning in us. It is a participation in his divine being. God and the one that loves him become one thing.

Who will help me to make all souls understand the power and excellence of love and how rich is the soul simply by being able to love? If all would appreciate this treasure, there would not be poverty or pain on this earth, because love would change everything into heaven. As a proof of how love is our all and does all, notice this detail. Holy Mass was just beginning and I said to myself: "I want to hear it well, because by one Mass well attended, I am certain that my faults will be pardoned." With this intention I united myself to Jesus through Mary and I practiced other acts to this effect, remaining recollected until the Gospel. But then, until Communion I was distracted without realizing that I was at Mass. On realizing it, I was confounded and exclaimed, "My Jesus, my fervor of wanting to hear Mass well has stopped here." And I perceived in my interior the voice of the Lord saying to me: "You can desire something to be well done, but you cannot effect it. I have to do it in you and you must recognize your nothingness and impotency. This is what has happened here. You had the good will, but I have fulfilled it for you." And with this I was consoled.
