**THREE PATHWAYS, ONE MISSION:
AN INVITATION TO RENEWAL**

“I invite all of the baptized to step forward with courage into this new season of renewal.”

Three Pathways, One Mission is Bishop Bruce’s invitation to the whole Diocese of Providence to enter a season of renewal, not a passing program but an ongoing process of personal, pastoral, and missionary conversion, rooted in the pattern of Christ’s own life: the Incarnation, the Cross, and the Eucharist. From that pattern flows three pathways that unfold together.

- **Living the Mission** is the parish living out its baptismal call, gathered by Christ and sent to witness in homes, workplaces, and neighborhoods, moving beyond maintaining activity to a missionary culture in which all the baptized, not the clergy alone, discern and act together.
- **Forming for Mission** builds a shared vision and common language, beginning with pastors, staffs, and core teams and reaching the whole parish, as it forms leaders for today and tomorrow and walks with parishes that want support.
- **Planning for Mission** gathers pastors and parishioners in designated planning areas to ask together what God is calling them to look like for mission.

Much of this pathway early on will take shape through the Parish Assemblies this fall and the Diocesan Assembly on November 14 at LaSalle Academy. Find the Bishop’s invitation and the full “**Three Pathways, One Mission**” document at:

FROM THE RECTOR - Monsignor Mancini

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

I would like to share with you the following meditation:

The Power of His Touch

Consider how fire, when placed in a brazen vessel, communicates to it the power of producing the effects of heat. So the all-powerful Word of God also, having joined by a real union unto himself the living and intelligent temple taken from the holy Virgin, endowed it with the power of actively exerting his own godlike might.

As a proof that his own flesh possessed the power of healing, as being the flesh of God, he touched [Peter’s mother-in-law’s] hand, and immediately, it says, *the fever left her*. Let us, therefore, also receive Jesus; for when he has entered into us, and we have received him into mind and heart, then he will quench the fever of unbefitting pleasures, and raise us up, and make us strong in things spiritual, so as for us to minister unto him, by performing those things that please him.

But observe again how great is the efficacy of the touch of his holy flesh. For it drives away diseases of various kinds and a crowd of demons, overthrows the power of the devil, and heals a very great multitude of people. And though able to perform these miracles by a word and the inclination of his will, yet to teach us something useful for us, he also lays his hands upon the sick. For it was necessary, most necessary, for us to learn that the holy flesh which he had made his own was endowed with the activity of the power of the Word by his having implanted in it a godlike might. Let it then take hold of us, or rather let us take hold of it by the mystical “giving of thanks” [Eucharist] that it may free us also from the sicknesses of the soul, and from the assault and violence of demons.
