LECTIO DIVINA

A PRAYERFUL READING OF SACRED SCRIPTURE

The Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Easter [John 10:11-18]

Jesus said: "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."

This passage has become so familiar that it may have lost some of its strangeness. On consideration, does it not seem odd for a shepherd to lay down his life for his sheep? After all, sheep are raised and tended for the survival of the shepherd. From the sheep, shepherds attain wool for their clothing and food for their body. And sheep were sacrificed at the Temple on Passover for the good of man's soul.

Of course, since the sheep were kept for the sake of the shepherd, he would want to defend his sheep from anything that threatens them, just as King David, when he was a shepherd, defeated lions and bears in defending his flock (1Sm 17). However, defending a flock because it is his livelihood is a far cry from willingly laying down his life so that the sheep can preserve theirs.

A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep.

A hired man does not have the same sense of responsibility and ownership for the sheep that a true shepherd does. The hired man does not depend on the sheep for his livelihood in the way a shepherd does; he depends on the person who pays his wages. And because he does not care for the sheep but instead about his wages, it is natural that a hired man would flee when he sees a wolf coming. He willingly abandons the flock and will seek employment elsewhere. Jesus acknowledged that others break into the sheepfold, thieves and robbers, with the intention to destroy, but my sheep hear my voice...and they shall never perish, and no one shall snatch them out of my hand (Jn 10:27-28).
